

About the Site

With its diverse landscapes, abundant wildlife and endless recreational opportunities, Pinckney Recreation Area is a must-visit destination for campers, mountain bikers, anglers and other recreation enthusiasts. Nestled amidst rolling hills and serene lakes, the landscape features a terminal moraine area formed during the last glaciation period.

Pinckney is known for its extensive trail system and chain of excellent fishing lakes. More than 40 miles of multi-use trail take visitors through lush forests and along sparkling lakes. For the ultimate backcountry experience, pitch a tent at one of the remote campsites scattered throughout the area. The 11,000-acre park is a large park and fairly spread out. The park features two main day-use areas: Silver Lake and Halfmoon Lake units, where visitors enjoy picnicking, swimming, boating and relaxing by the water.

Take either I-96 West or I-94 West.

From I-96W – Take I-96 W to M-23 South, west on North Territorial Road, to Hankerd Road (turn right), and then left on Half Moon Lake Access Rd to the parking lot and picnic shelter. (First Left)


or

From I-94W - Take I-94 West to M-23 North, west on North Territorial Rd, to Hankerd Road (turn right) and then left on Half Moon Lake Access Rd to the parking lot and picnic shelter. (First left)

Coming from the West (Kalamazoo):

I-94 East to M-52 North (also called N Main St) to Werkner Road take the first right in the roundabout, turn right on Island Lake Rd, and turn left on Stofer Road, Take Stofer Road to North Territorial Rd, turn right, take North Territorial Rd to Hankerd Rd, turn left on Hankerd Rd, and then turn left on Half Moon Lake Access Rd to the parking lot and picnic shelter. 

Eligibility

NCA draft tests are open to only purebred Newfoundland dogs of either sex that are at least 18 months old on the date of the test. Other restrictions listed in the NCA rules also apply. Bitches in season are allowed but will be tested after all other entrants have been tested that day. Please inform a test committee member as soon as possible if you will be bringing a bitch in season to the test. They must be crated away from other dogs in an area designated by the test committee. At least one other bitch must be available to perform group exercises with any bitch in season. Bitches that have had an ovarian sparing spay are required to be tested as "Bitches in Season".

Entries and Fees

Entry fee is \$50.00 for all single or team entries.

Online entry is available and is preferred at <https://workingentry.ncadogs.org>

Entries will only be accepted from NCA members online or postmarked Saturday February 28th, 2026, or later.

Entries will only be accepted from Non-NCA members online or postmarked Tuesday March 10th, 2026, or later.

All entries close at the home of the Test Secretary on Wednesday, April 8th, 2026, at 11:59 PM EDT. After that time, entries cannot be accepted, canceled, altered, or substituted.

Online Entry

If you are an NCA member, you will provide your login and password. If not a member, you will provide the same contact information that you would provide on a paper entry. You will need to upload a copy of your dog's registration certificate, so please create an electronic version of that document ahead of time. You will be prompted for your credit card information to complete the entry. If you later need to pull or change your entry, that must be done through the test secretary and not using the online entry tool.

Exhibitor Responsibilities

Each exhibitor is responsible for providing his/her own proper equipment. Each exhibitor is responsible for the knowledge of the official NCA Regulations governing a Draft Test and the applicable Standards of Performance. Regulations can be downloaded from the NCA website by choosing Draft Test Regulations on the page <https://www.ncadogs.org/forms.html>.

All dogs not currently being tested should always be leashed or crated. They cannot walk any maneuvering or freight haul courses except during official course familiarization times. As a courtesy to other entrants, please try to keep your dogs quiet.

Weight Exchange Items



The DDX and TDDX tests require the entrant to perform a weight exchange. The test committee will provide the following items for this maneuver: one 30-pound bag of dog food inside a canvas sack. There will be two of each item for TDDX.

Weight Exchange: one 30# Bag, approximately 25" x 16" x 3"

Unentered Dogs

Exhibitors' well-behaved dogs not entered in the tests are welcome to attend. However, these dogs must not interfere with the dogs being tested. They will be crated away from the official draft test area and must remain quiet.

Spectators

Spectators are welcome to observe the Draft Test from designated areas but are not permitted to bring dogs.

Waiver of Rights - Animals in Distress

The Newfoundland Club of America, Inc, and the regional club hosting this event reserves the right to remove any animal in distress from a parked vehicle or crate, and all persons attending this dog event hereby waives any claim for damages against the Club for such removal. The NCA regards the health, safety, and life of any dog on the event grounds to be paramount to other property or privacy rights. If the owner cannot be found in a timely manner, we will take whatever action is necessary for the safety of the dog, which may include breaking windows to enter a vehicle. Dogs found in an unsafe environment, distress, or in harm's way (for example, left in a vehicle without proper ventilation) will be removed to safety. Exposing a dog to an unsafe environment, distress, or harm's way is considered mistreatment and subject to appropriate discipline.

Out of Control Dog Policy

This policy was approved by the NCA Board of Directors on November 11th, 2023.

At all NCA Events dogs must be kept under control to prevent harm to itself or others. It is the owner/handler's responsibility to ensure their dogs are under control for the duration of the event.

At NCA events dogs must be crated or leashed and collared at all times, except when the dogs are required to perform off leash. When dogs are leashed, the length of the leash must not exceed SIX (6) feet and the leash may NOT be a retractable leash.

Dogs should not be allowed to approach another dog without permission from the other dog's owner/handler.

Any dog that, in the opinion of the judges, event committee or designated safety officer representing the event, appears dangerous, shall be asked to leave the event promptly or be crated for the duration of the event and is excused from further participation in the event. Anyone who witnesses a dog appearing to be dangerous should bring their concerns to the judges, event committee or safety officer. Part of upholding good sportsmanship is to take action through the appropriate channels.

Examples of out-of-control behavior would include but is not limited to:

Aggressive vocalization such as barking and growling, or aggressive behavior toward any person or animal such as snapping, biting, lunging, charging, attacking or attempting to attack at any time while on the test grounds.

Owners and handlers are responsible for monitoring the well-being and safety of their dog(s). If left unattended the owner/handler must check on them frequently to ensure they are safe.

If the dog is excused from the test grounds for aggression, the automatic grievance policy of the NCA is enacted. If an injury to dog or person occurs, the AKC Rules Applying to Dog Shows Ch 11, section 15 goes into effect. (References, chapter 2, section 14 in both water and draft regulations)




